

100% Grass-Fed Beef
British breeds that are of a moderate frame, short, deep,
thick, and well-muscled are preferred

- Producer must have access to computer with internet and email address
- Production schedule and volume will be communicated via internet
- Calves must remain on their mother's milk for a minimum of 120 days
- Once weaned, their diet can be any combination of forages, and/or any stored feeds from forages
- Feed rations
 - Absolutely NO grain, mature corn silage are allowed at any time
 - Absolutely NO animal by-products are allowed in feed rations
 - Absolutely NO antibiotics are permitted at anytime
 - No steroids are allowed in feed
 - No synthetic hormones are allowed in feed
- Pastures must be free of synthetic chemicals, pesticides. Native Meats strongly recommends adding a small herd of sheep and intensive rotation grazing to control weeds and increase soil fertility. When no biological methods are effective, label herbicides may be approved by a Native Meats inspector.
- At Native Meats we strongly believe that healthy soil is the foundation for sustainable farming and high quality products. We require that soil resources are managed using practices that maintain their integrity. Grazing and fertility should be managed in a manner that encourages long term soil stability and productivity and benefits the environment. Establishment of legumes to improve forage quality, increase animal gains, and decrease reliance on commercial fertilizers is also strongly encouraged.
- Live animal specifications
 - All cattle must be visually inspected by a Native Meats representative thirty days prior to slaughter
 - Thick, deep, moderate framed British breeds are preferred
 - Animals must be less than thirty month of age at harvest and produce carcass weights between 550-800 pounds (950-1400 pound liveweight)
 - We reserve the right to reject any animal which does not meet our standards or those rejected by USDA inspectors
- Visual Traits also include: short, well-muscled, calm disposition, broad, flat back, soft hide, and oily hair
- All veterinary treatments including routine de-worming treatments must be recorded in a record-keeping system and available for inspection
- The producer must be willing to submit to start-up and annual inspections
- Low stress, humane handling procedures are required
- The producer has the responsibility of transporting the livestock to the processing plant
- Payment structure –payment on beef will be mailed via USPS within twenty-one days of harvest date. Native Meats pricing structure is subject to change upon a minimum of sixty days written notice from Native Meats
- Current price –hot carcass weight per pound \$1.35

Chicken Program Protocol
Cornish X Rocks

- Producer must have access to a computer with internet and email address
- Production schedule and volume will be communicated via internet
- Minimum of five acres of pasture land
- Minimum batch order is 400 birds
- Maximum stocking rate of 500 birds per acre per year
- Two to four weeks in a suitable brooder
- Four to six weeks on pasture with adequate portable shelter moved daily to fresh, clean ground allowing 2.0 square feet per bird
- Fresh, clean water available at all times
- Feed rations
 - Absolutely NO animal by-products are allowed in feed rations
 - All ruminant, pork, poultry, fish or seafood by-products are prohibited
 - Absolutely no sub-therapeutic (feed grade) antibiotics are permitted in feed or at anytime
 - No steroids are allowed in feed
 - No synthetic hormones are allowed in feed
- Native Meats reserves the right to reject any birds that do not meet our standards or those rejected by USDA inspectors
- The producer has the responsibility of transporting the birds to the processing plant
- The producer must be willing to submit to start up and annual inspections by Native Meats' representatives
- Payment structure –payment on chicken will be mailed via USPS within fourteen days after harvest date. Native Meats' pricing structure is subject to change upon a minimum of sixty days written notice from Native Meats
- Current Price –hot carcass weight per pound \$1.20 with a target weight of six to eight pounds in eight weeks

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100% Grass-Fed Lamb
Hair/Meat Breeds

- Producer must have access to computer with internet and email address
- Production schedule and volume will be communicated via internet
- Lamb must remain on mother's milk for a minimum of ninety days
- Once weaned, their diet can be any combination of forages and/or any stored feeds from forages
- Feed rations
 - Absolutely NO grain, mature corn silage are allowed at any time
 - Absolutely NO animal by-products are allowed in feed rations
 - Absolutely NO antibiotics are permitted at anytime
 - No steroids are allowed in feed
 - No synthetic hormones are allowed in feed
- Pastures must be free of synthetic chemicals, pesticides. When no biological methods are effective, label herbicides may be approved by a Native Meats inspector.
- All veterinary treatments, including routine de-worming treatments must be recorded in a record-keeping system and available for inspection
- De-worming is permitted, provided your records are available for inspection
- Live animal specifications –lamb must be at least ninety days old with a maximum age of twelve months and ninety pounds live weight
- The producer has the responsibility of transporting the livestock to the processing plant
- Native Meats reserves the right to reject any animal which does not meet our standards or those rejected by USDA inspectors
- Producer must submit to start-up and annual inspections from Native Meats representatives
- Low stress, humane handling procedures are required
- Payment structure –payment on lamb will be mailed via USPS within fourteen days of harvest date; Native Meats price structure is subject to change upon a minimum of sixty days written notice from Native Meats
- Current price –hot carcass weight per pound \$2.50

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Pork Program Protocol
50% Berkshire

- Producer must have access to a computer with internet and email address
- Production schedule and volume will be communicated via internet
- Minimum of five acres of pasture and/or woodlands
- Maximum stocking rates
 - Farrow to feeder –one sow per acre
 - Farrow to finish –half sow per acre
 - Feeder to finish –twenty pigs per acre
- Must provide clean, fresh water at all times
- Enclosed field-drinker or nipple waterers ONLY, no open tubs or tanks; creeks and ponds must be fenced off
- Pigs must be raised on pasture; no confinement facilities
- Deep bedding may be used for farrowing sows
- Feed Rations
 - Absolutely no animal by-products are allowed in feed rations; all ruminant, pork, poultry, fish or seafood by-products are prohibited
 - Absolutely no slop, stale or moldy bread, rotten produce, or waste products shall be fed to feeder pigs, only an approved, balanced feed ration is allowed
 - Absolutely no sub-therapeutic (feed grade) antibiotics are permitted in feed
 - No synthetic hormones are allowed in feed
 - No steroids are allowed in feed
- De-worming is permitted, provided your records are available for inspection
- Absolutely no antibiotics are permitted at anytime
- The producer has the responsibility of transporting the animals to the processing plant
- Native Meats reserves the right to reject any animal which does not meet our standards or those rejected by USDA inspectors
- The producer must be willing to submit to start up and annual inspections from Native Meats representatives
- Payment structure
 - Payment on pork will be mailed via USPS within fourteen days of harvest date
 - Native Meats' pricing structure is subject to change upon a minimum of sixty days written notice from Native Meats
- Current price –hot carcass weight per pound \$0.95; a target live weight is 260 pounds

- Producer must have access to computer with internet and email address

- Minimum of five acres of pasture land
- Two to four weeks in a suitable brooder
- Fresh, clean water available at all times
- Feed rations
 - Absolutely NO animal by-products are allowed in feed rations
 - All ruminant, pork, poultry, fish or seafood by-products are prohibited
 - Absolutely no sub-therapeutic (feed grade) antibiotics are permitted in feed or at anytime
 - No steroids are allowed in feed
 - No synthetic hormones are allowed in feed
- Native Meats reserves the right to reject any birds that do not meet our standards or those rejected by USDA inspectors
- The producer has the responsibility of transporting the birds to the processing plant
- The producer must be willing to submit to start up and annual inspections by Native Meats' representatives
- Payment structure –payment on turkey will be mailed via USPS within fourteen days after harvest date. Native Meats' pricing structure is subject to change upon a minimum of sixty days written notice from Native Meats
